### Chaplain's Report:



Dear Brother Knights,

As Knights we need to ask ourselves what makes us practical Catholics. We need to ask ourselves about what makes us Catholic. So what does it mean to be Catholic? What does it mean to have faith? What is religion? What is the plan of God for man? The Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCCC) states: *God, infinitely perfect and blessed in himself, in a plan of sheer goodness freely created man to make him share in his own blessed life. In the fullness of time, God the Father sent his Son as the Redeemer and Savior of mankind, fallen into sin, thus calling all into his Church and, through the work of the Holy Spirit, making them adopted*

*children and heirs of his eternal happiness (#1).*

Why does man have a desire for God? God wants us to follow him and to have a relationship with him. God wants to reveal himself to us, has spoken and acts through human history. God reveals himself through his Son, Jesus Christ, through the Bible, through Tradition, and through the teachings of the Magisterium (the Church leadership).

Sacred Scripture is one place where God's plan for us is revealed. The Bible is not one book but a collection of books accepted by the Church as the authentic, inspired record of God's revelation of himself to humanity and his will to bring about the salvation of all. It is composed of the Old Testament which contains 46 books (Protestant Bibles contain 39 books) and the New Testament composed of 27 books. During the Liturgy of the Word at Sunday Mass we see how the Old Testament readings are joined to the New Testament readings including the Gospels revealing God's plan of redemption for us and how we can live our faith.

Tradition is the second way in which we learn about God's plan for us. When you think of tradition you think of things you have done, customs or habits you have. When we think of Tradition it is not old customs but Apostolic Tradition. *Apostolic Tradition is the transmission of the message of Christ, brought about from the very beginnings of Christianity by means of preaching, bearing witness, institutions, worship, and inspired writings. The apostles transmitted all they had received from Christ and learned from the Holy Spirit to their successors, the bishops of the through them to all generations until the end of the world (CCCC #12).*

*Apostolic Tradition occurs in two ways: through the living transmission of the word of God (also simply called Tradition) and through Sacred Scripture which is the same proclamation of the salvation in written form (CCCC #13).*

The question we need to ask ourselves is do we actually know what the Word of God is and what it says? Or do we know what we think it says or what others say it says? The only way to get to know the Word of God is to read it. We actually have to open our Bibles and read them. So this month, let us resolve to be men and women of faith. Let us resolve to spend time each day in prayer reading our Bibles. Then we can start to see God's plan for our lives. Next month I will explore the relationships between Tradition, Sacred Scripture, and the Magisterium. I will also explore the concept of the deposit of faith and what we can learn from it. God reveals himself to us and we need to respond to God's call. So stay tuned...

### Poll: Success Linked to Ethics

A poll of Americans and high-level business leaders proved what Knights of Columbus insurance agents have known for generations: religious beliefs and values should be an integral guide to business decision making. Those surveyed also revealed they believe personal and corporate gain drives executives' decisions. Overall, they believe, as do the majority of the executives polled, that the moral compass of corporate America points in the wrong direction. Only 19 percent of Americans would award corporate America a grade of A or B for its honesty and ethical conduct. Forty percent of these respondents had the banking and financial industry in mind when answering.

The positive side is that 75 percent of Americans surveyed believe that it is possible to be successful and ethical in business. They also believe that high ethical standards strengthen a company's advantage over its competitors, in both the short- and long-term. Additionally, more than 90 percent of people strongly consider a company's reputation for honesty and ethical conduct when considering whether or not to invest with them. Nearly two-thirds of those polled believe corporate leaders should rely on their religious values for guidance in the business arena. In this tough economic climate, it's of paramount importance that all Knights are reminded of the moral, ethical commitment of the Order to serve its members and their families. Earning just a passing grade is not acceptable to me or the other professional insurance agents of the Knights of Columbus.

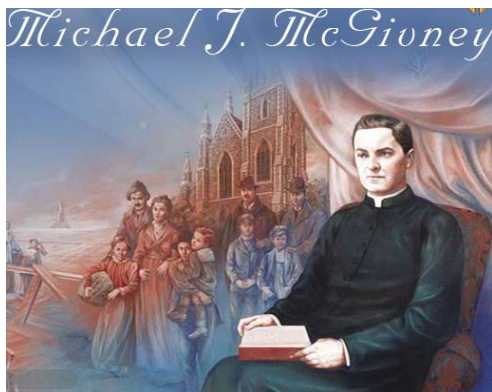

**Financial Control Policy**

This Policy establishes the Basic Financial Controls to be followed by all Knights of Columbus Members of Council #13456.

- All cash collected from any source applicable to Council #13456 Activities, Events, Fund Raisers, etc. will be delivered to the Financial Secretary within Five (5) Days of Receipt.
- Cash collection logs for all events involving fees will be maintained and given to the Financial Secretary. Receipts should be provided to anyone paying by Cash. (Receipt books can be obtained from the Financial Secretary)
- Funds collected from participants cannot be used to offset the expenses for the Activities, Events, Fund Raisers, etc. Expenses will be paid by Council Check upon submission of the documents to support the expenses. Checks to pay for tickets/fees/etc can be issued in advance when deposits of pre-payments received from attendants/participants are provided to the Financial Secretary.
- Participation/attendance for all events/ activity requiring fees will be collected in advance. In rare cases fees may be collected at the door or event by prior arrangement. In these cases, persons requesting payment at the door or event should understand that they will be responsible for any expenses incurred by the council due to late cancellation or “no shows.”
- Receipts for expenses incurred by members will be submitted to the Financial Secretary within seven days. Original receipts are required and will be itemized and totaled with the purpose of the expenditure indicated.
- All contracts with other organizations, companies, etc. will be signed by the Grand Knight and the Financial Secretary. All contracts must be reviewed and approved by the Council Officers. **Absolutely no changes** to the Terms and Conditions or any part of the contract without first contacting the Financial Secretary.
- Checks for services provided by members of Council #13456 to other organizations or companies, including refunds, rebates, etc. will be made payable to the “Knights of Columbus Council #13456” and mailed directly to the Financial Secretary.
- The Annual Council Budget will be drawn up and completed by the end of August of each year. It is the responsibility of all members to submit complete project information, including complete cost of that program (for previous activities, you can update last year’s information.) If the program is submitted and placed in the budget, a document will be produced and given to the Chairman that will show that the specific activities have been approved by the Officers and Council Membership
- Under no circumstances may a member of this Council approach Parish Office Staff (including Pastor/Administrator, or Parochial Vicar) with any proposal, or resource commitment, without an approved project plan and budget, signed by the Grand Knight and the Financial Secretary.
- Projects that arise that are not included in the Annual Council Budget will follow the same guidelines as normal budget submissions. A project plan and budget is to be submitted to the Financial Secretary and Grand Knight in sufficient time for their review prior to presentation to the Council Officers and the Council to be voted on. If proposed expenditures for the project exceed \$500 a minimum of 4 months are required before the proposed activity date, in order to comply with the Knights of Columbus and Council 13456 Constitutional requirements.
